RA is the *gold* standard of training












RA is your workforce solution

- Registered apprenticeship builds a pipeline of skilled workers
- * RA gives employers a strategy to tap into new recruitment pools as well as upskill your existing workforce
- * RA trains workers from the start with no previous experience necessary
- RA passes down knowledge and experience from experienced/retiring workers to the next generation

RECRUITING WOMEN TO APPRENTICESHIP

- RA puts women on an equal footing
- Structured wage and skill progression
- Mentorship
- Better wages, equitable with men
- It's *free* training for workers



RA and Women: Elements of Success

- Pre-apprenticeship
- Women-only cohorts
- Targeted recruitment
- Mentoring one-on-one, support groups
- Jointly sponsored programs: higher completion rates (Source: <u>Urban Institute</u>)
- Address discrimination/harassment on the job site
